



## **Univ. Prof. Dr. Reinhard Heinisch**

*Universität Salzburg & University of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania*



Reinhard Heinisch is Professor of Austrian Politics in Comparative European Perspective and Head of the Department of Political Science at the University of Salzburg, Austria. He received his degrees from the Universities of Vienna (B.A. equivalent 1986), Virginia Tech (M.A. 1989), and Michigan State (PhD 1994). Subsequently, he served as Professor of Political Science with the University of Pittsburgh (1994-2009), USA. During that time period he also was the Director of International Studies at the Johnstown Campus of the University of Pittsburgh. From 2001 to 2008, Reinhard Heinisch regularly took students to work on a development project in rural Bolivia and led other international studies initiatives, for which received the PaCI outstanding international educator award.

Reinhard Heinisch is the author of *Populism Proporz Pariah – Austria Turns Right* (2002) as well as of numerous other publications. He has lectured extensively internationally and served as a consultant to the US Department of State. In his teaching, he has focused generally on comparative government with an emphasis on Europe, Latin America and the United States and has commented about the US in the Austrian media and in US media about Austria. He currently teaches courses on comparative labor market policies, the welfare state, populism, and Austria in the context of European integration. His main area of work includes comparative populism, populist incumbency, as well as research on corporatism under conditions of integration and internationalization. Reinhard Heinisch continues to serve as an academic advisor board member of the University of Pittsburgh, European Union Center of Excellence, the advisory board of *Politique Européenne*, and the US-based Botstiber Foundation.
